Dear Siblings in Christ,

How quickly that day arrives will depend on your perspective. Until then, try to use your time wisely. Enjoy being at home with your loved ones (two footed or four footed). Practice spending time listening to birds singing, God speaking, and the sound of your own soul.


Are you still waiting for your stimulus check?
